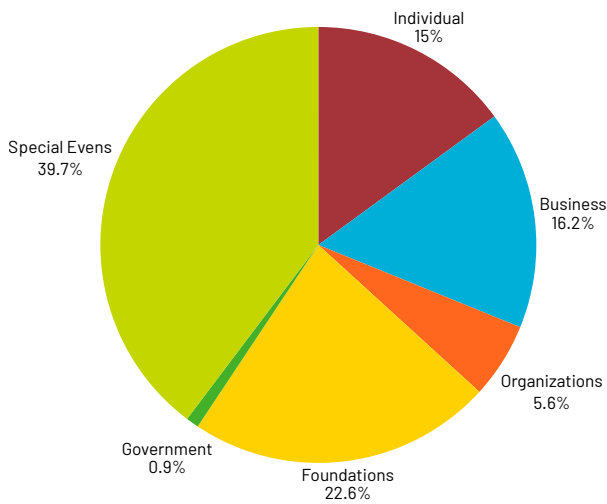

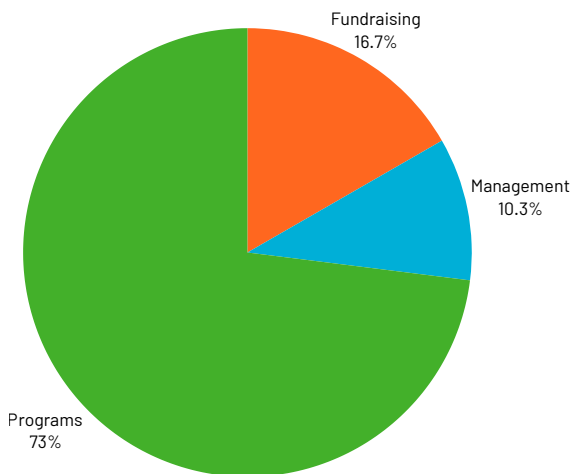

LOOKING AHEAD

2025 was a year of meaningful growth and impact for Habitat. We celebrated the completion of our first 10-plex townhome development, welcoming ten new homeowners and marking a major milestone in expanding affordable homeownership in Summit County.

Our Overall Ball Gala achieved record-breaking success, increasing funding by 32% over 2024 and generating unprecedented unrestricted support through Fund a Mission. Education programs also grew, equipping dozens of local individuals and families with the tools for successful homeownership.

The Habitat ReStore saw multiple record-setting sales months, directly supporting our build programs, while three major foundation grants enabled us to complete the final ten homes of our 26-home Silver Creek Village development.

Looking ahead to 2026, we remain focused on advancing new housing opportunities and programs that create lasting impact across our communities.
